NEO/Stephen Mosgrove

- Roadwork scheduled to begin in the 700 block of Dublin has started in Hollygrove due to high river water.
- COVID reopening – Phase I.  
Question: It is difficult for small business to re-open with such small customer base allowed. Also, there is a CDC study that shows inside recirculating air spreads the virus. Stephen will get back to us about these issues.

CM Joe Giarusso

- COVID – reopening. Slow, we are still understanding what this means
- HANO-IRIS. Will write a letter in support of project, stipulating that neighbors are still engaged
- Polling Places. Because of COVID concerns, polling places are to change: 3 precincts will be at Mater Delorosa and 3 at CCEC.
- Council Meetings on Zoom. If you want to come to City Hall, it is possible with social distancing. Land use issues not being heard at this moment.
- Food Pantry / Second Harvest Food Bank, 9-11. 60,000 lbs of food. 450 cars
- City's Budget gap is being reviewed.
- S&WB: May 1 reports due. Asked them to respond to 4 questions.
- Question: What about nonprofit taxes. Because of covid and the financial state of so many nonprofits, – that issue is on pause.

Catherine Wheeler – SOUL would like to keep planting trees in our neighborhood. There is an online application. Please encourage neighbors to apply.

Theodore Thompson – Eye on Surveillance

Presentation on concerns re: City Cameras included: history of surveillance, and how cameras/facial recognition can be used inappropriately in community. Issues with civil liberties, mismanagement, etc. CRNA is willing to support this effort and asked that the organization be in contact with us for next steps.

Interim Zoning District (IZD) in Maple Area

CRNA approved a letter to be written in support of the IZD proposed by CM Giarusso. The City Planning Commission will review this City Council motion very soon.
